COURSE DESCRIPTION

The purpose of this course is to establish a strong framework that will enable students to document any use of force properly and thoroughly while in the execution of their duties. The lessons learned in this course will provide students with the ability to continuously hone their skills in the art of report writing, specifically related to use of force. This class is designed for line-level staff and Command Staff.

Students will:

- Assess & recognize where their UOF reporting is deficient
- Learn to recall UOF incidents cognitively
- Learn to organize theirs thoughts & translate them into a document
- Identify their professional & personal experiences, including training, & how they affect UOF decision-making
- Understand how to use their agency's UOF policy more constructively
- Better identify & understand the use of evidence for report writing

Today's environment requires law enforcement professionals to increase their skills in every aspect to better protect themselves, their organization, and the public's trust. Complete and proper documentation is the cornerstone of all law enforcement organizations, so it is imperative that all **Use of Force** documentation provides the details needed to recreate the event and protect all stakeholders involved.
